a darkly satirical novel of love revenge and 1950s haute couture now a major motion picture starring kate winslet judy davis liam hemsworth and hugo weaving after twenty years spent mastering the art of dressmaking at couture houses in paris tilly dunnage returns to the small australian town she was banished from as a child she plans only to check on her ailing mother and leave but tilly decides to stay and though she is still an outcast her lush exquisite dresses prove irresistible to the prim women of dungatar through her fashion business her friendship with

cooperation and tolerance while proto europe floundered in opposition to islam making virtues out of hereditary aristocracy religious intolerance perpetual war and slavery this masterful history begins with the fall of the persian and roman empires followed by the rise of the prophet muhammad and five centuries of engagement between the muslim imperium and an emerging europe essential and urgent god s crucible underscores the importance of these early world altering events whose influence remains as current as today s headlines the crucible is a 1952 play by the american playwright arthur miller it is a dramatization of the salem witch trials that took place in the province of massachusetts bay during 1692 and 1693 miller wrote the play as an allegory of mccarthyism when the us government blacklisted accused communists miller himself was questioned by the house of representatives committee on un american activities in 1956 and convicted of contempt of congress for refusing to identify others present at meetings he had attended it was first performed at the martin beck theater on broadway on january 22 1953 miller felt that this production was too stylized and cold and the reviews for it were largely hostile although the new york times noted a powerful play in a driving performance nonetheless the production won the 1953 best play tony award a year later a new production succeeded and the play became a classic it is a central work in the canon of american drama fuji books edition of the crucible contains supplementary texts tragedy and the common man an essay by arthur miller excerpts from nathaniel hawthorne s magnus opus the scarlet letter a narrative of the salem witch trials a few selected quotes of arthur miller this dramatic and deeply moving book combines a narrative that has the pace and excitement of a novel a timeless portrait of bigotry and a self righteousness and an authentic history of the salem witch trials it stands alone in applying modern psychiatric knowledge to the witchcraft hysteria nearly three hundred years ago the fate of massachusetts was delivered into the hands of a pack of young
